



From the Mayor's Desk:

***“What happened to “Kimberly Clean-Up Day”?*** Several years ago the City Council started “Kimberly Clean-Up Day” in an effort to simply “Clean up the Town”. At that time if a resident wanted to take a load of trash to the dump, it was a fairly long trip out to the County Landfill south of the airport. Although this has been a popular program, the cost associated has continued to rise significantly given the relatively small percentage of residents that take advantage of the service. Last year the landfill fees to the city were approximately \$6000. This amount does not include additional hours worked for city staff and other ancillary cost. Today we are fortunate to have a Landfill Transfer Station just 4 miles down the road, and due to budget constraints the decision was made to discontinue the program. I personally used the transfer station for the first time this spring and it cost me around \$6.00 for a pickup load. I know that some residents have expressed their disappointment, but out of respect and fairness to every resident in town given the current economic times, this was an easy decision.

***Budget & Utility Rates*** - It is budget time again for your City Council. More workshops and public hearings are coming up prior to adopting the 2009-2010 FY Budget. Please feel free to attend as your City Council works through the budget process this year. Utility fees (Water, Sewer, and Sanitation) for 2009-2010 will see a modest 4.99% increase this next year. This will equate to \$3.74 over the current year rate schedule beginning in October 2009.

## Additional Garbage Carts Increase Landfill Fees to City

Out of more than 1100 homes in Kimberly, there are approximately 280 utilizing additional sanitation carts. These additional carts are rented directly from Western Waste Services at \$2.75 per month. Currently the City does not have a fee for the added landfill cost associated with the use of additional carts. At this time every household in Kimberly pays \$7.74 per month for limited service. This includes one cart and once per week garbage pick-up. The City has experienced a deficit in the amount collected and the amount we pay Twin Falls County for landfill. In fairness to all residents of Kimberly and especially those residents that do not require an extra cart, the City Council has proposed a Landfill Charge of \$4.00 per additional cart. This will make the total cost for an additional cart \$6.75. The City Council will have a Public Hearing on the proposed Landfill Charge on July 28<sup>th</sup>, 2009 at 6:00 p.m.

## Stimulus Funds Received

We are very excited to report in June we were notified that the City of Kimberly had been awarded \$400,000 through the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) for the reconstruction of Center Street. We feel very fortunate to receive this funding, as there were only 4 projects funded in District IV. Initially we submitted our first and second selections, which according to the ARRA, it did not meet their requirements. Gratefully, the re-construction of the Center street project was accepted and awarded. After the project development fees are deducted from the \$400,000, the City should have \$284,000 for the construction portion of the project. We are already in the initial phases of the project; however actual construction will not begin until next spring. The testing of the existing road is taking place now, which will determine the scope of the project after it is completed. We are still continuing to pursue additional funding opportunities through the ARRA and will keep you updated on our progress.

## Master Street ST Plan Adopted

At the June 9<sup>th</sup> city council meeting your city council adopted the new Master Transportation Plan. This new transportation plan is a revised addition to the old master street plan that was adopted five years ago. The new plan not only has updated design incorporated within it but also places a requirement on new development to perform a TIA or Traffic Impact Analysis. The TIA provides us with a summary projection of the most probable impact the traffic will place on our community from proposed new development's or businesses. Depending on the result of the TIA, we now also have the added ability to require a more thorough study if needed called a TIS or Traffic Impact Study. Information derived from these studies helps determine the course and approach needed to make our community safer for travel. Whether it be the addition of a turning lane or a traffic signal light this information will be invaluable in our decision making process. This also insures that new development will be adding these required improvement costs to their respective development.

We will continue to work diligently on your behalf and ever vigilant in our attempt to stay ahead of the curve of progress and the many challenges that growth places in the road before us.

## UPDATED COMPREHENSIVE PLAN

On April 7, 2009 the Planning and Zoning Commission approved an updated Comprehensive Plan and Map. On June 9, 2009 the City Council gave their approval of the updated plan and map.

The Comprehensive Plan was updated with new dates and information about Kimberly, with a new Transportation Plan, Zoning District, and City parks. Housing and population increases have been updated to reflect the 2009 numbers along with the City limits that has expanded from approximately from 520 acres to 960 acres. The Kimberly School District 414 is building new classrooms and buildings for our growing community.

These are just a few items that have been updated and/or changed in the new Comprehensive Plan.

## East End Provider Building Project

The East End Providers was organized in the late 1980's for the purpose of providing food and clothing to low income people in eastern Twin Falls County. This area is primarily made up of the communities of Kimberly, Hansen and Murtaugh and the surrounding rural areas. Through sound management practices, word of mouth and a dedicated group of volunteers, East End Providers has established itself as an outstanding charitable organization where every dollar is accounted for and used to help the truly needy. From school children, to the unemployed to the homeless, East End Providers is a constant source of support.

East End Providers relies strictly on donations and has no paid staff. In 2008, donations totaled over \$25,000 and over 600 children and 200 families were served. Community volunteers worked nearly 8,000 hours making up food baskets, gathering clothing, collecting donations and delivering food and clothing to needy families. The organization currently operates from a small house donated by a local church, the back of a hair dressing shop in Kimberly and from some donated space by local Kimberly businesses. Due to a lack of space, food and clothing is stored in surplus school busses.

The East End Providers, City of Kimberly and Kimberly Lions Club are committed to the construction of a building to house the East End Providers. The City of Kimberly is providing a building site and the Kimberly Lions Club is kicking off the fund raising drive with a \$5,000 donation to the East End Providers Building Fund. With various in kind donations, we still need to raise another \$66,000 to complete the project.

While we are raising funds for a new building, we have to remember that East End Providers relies solely on annual donations to do the great work they do each year. We would ask that the building donation be above and beyond your normal donation to the East End Providers.

# Important Reminders from our Community Service Officer


## **ANIMAL REMINDERS....**

It is unlawful for any person to keep or maintain any pigs, hogs, mules, donkeys or birds of prey within the limits of the city. (Ord. 438 § 1, 1991)

No person shall own, possess or maintain under his control within the city limits, any live animals falling within any of the following groups:

- A. Poisonous Reptiles;
- B. Any Snake of the Constrictor Genus;
- C. Any Carnivorous Mammal, except for domestic dogs and cats (Ord. 438 § 1, 1991)

No person shall keep or maintain within the limits of the City any cattle, horses, sheep or goats without first obtaining a permit from the city clerk for said animals which permit may be issued and is subject to the certain requirements.




## Watering Restriction Days *End October 1<sup>st</sup>*

Even Number Houses: Tue, Thur, Sat  
Odd Number Houses: Wed, Fri, Sun

Water Restrictions apply between the hours of  
10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

**What will happen if the watering days are not followed?** Any unauthorized use of water is in violation of ordinance #560 which prohibits the watering of lawns and gardens shall be charged a fee of \$10.00 for the first violation and a \$25.00 fee for any subsequent unauthorized use which shall be added to the user's month water bill.



Dog Licenses need to be renewed annually.

Cost: \$10.00 per Dog  
OR  
\$ 5.00 for a New Register

Please provided proof of Rabies Shots.



## **Weed Control Reminder**

*From the middle of the street to the middle of the alley are the citizens of Kimberly's responsibility.*

According to Sterling Codifiers Chapter 8.12.040: Violation; Penalty

*The city officials may issue warning notices for any violation of this chapter. If the violation is not corrected within fifteen (15) days from the date of the warning notice, a penalty of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) will be assessed to the owner's, tenant's, occupant's, or developer's water bill for the first violation, and two hundred dollars (\$200.00) for the second violation, and three hundred dollars (\$300.00) for the third and subsequent violation during the same calendar year.*





# 2010 Census

IT'S IN OUR HANDS

Every 10 years the U.S. Constitution conducts a mandatory census of the population in the United States. On April 1, 2010 every household will receive a simple questionnaire asking for name, gender, age, race, ethnicity, relationship, and whether you own or rent your home. According to the 2010 Census website:

### *Why fill out the census form?*

- **It's important** – Census data affect funding for your community, your community's representation in Congress and your community leader's planning decisions.
- **It's easy** – The census questionnaire takes only a few minutes to answer and return by mail.
- **It's confidential** – Your responses are protected by law (Title 13, U.S. Code, Section 9). All Census Bureau employees have taken an oath to protect confidentiality and are subject to a jail term, a fine – or both – for disclosing any information that could identify a respondent or household.
- **It's required by law** – The information you provide is combined with responses provided by your neighbors and other households across the country, to provide summary statistical data that are used by various local, state and federal agencies.

## Increase in Idaho's Minimum Wage



According to the Idaho Department of Labor President Bush signed a bill that would increase the federal minimum wage in three steps. The final step is effective on July 24, 2009.

In July the minimum wage for Idaho will increase to **\$7.25 per hour**.
